KATE MORTON

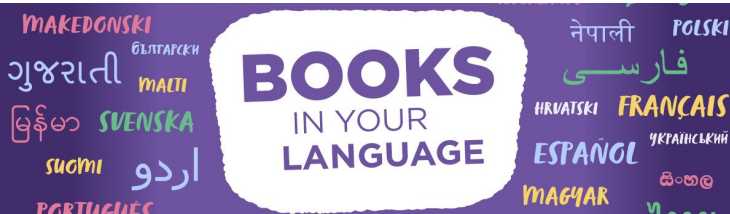

This year the State Library of NSW is celebrating 50 years of the Multicultural Bulk Loan Service. With more than 29 per cent of the population of NSW born overseas, and over 280 languages spoken, having access to books in your own language is incredibly important.

Since 1974, the State Library has proudly provided books in community languages to the people of NSW through the local public library network. We now have 43 languages on offer.

Public libraries are some of the only spaces in society that people can use free of charge. It is powerful for people to be able to see themselves in such spaces, and it is at the heart of giving them a sense of belonging.

Collections are at the core of the services public libraries provide — everyone should have access to information that meets their needs and be able to connect to their culture through stories and written language. The State Library has been committed to making this possible since 1974.

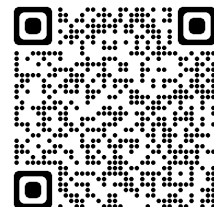
